Poudre River Education, Restoration & Celebration!

Poudre RiverFest is a **free**, family-friendly festival in Fort Collins, Colorado, that restores, celebrates and educates people about the Cache la Poudre River, an important natural resource in our community.

The festival features a variety of activities for people to explore the role of the river as an important habitat for wildlife, a recreation area and a source for clean drinking water. Educational and volunteer activities take place throughout the day with a culminating celebration in the afternoon.

- **Experience** scientific research at a bird banding station and go on nature walks to learn about the river and its inhabitants.
- **Volunteer** to enhance wildlife habitat along the river with hands-on service projects.
- **Learn** about conserving the Poudre River and its resources through a scavenger hunt and kids' activities.
- **Connect** with local organizations that conserve the river.
- **Dance** to live music from *12 Cents for Marvin*, *The Burroughs* and *Justin Roth*.
- **Enjoy** beer from New Belgium Brewing Co. and food from local eateries.
