Describe Primary conservation Issues, their seriousness and any steps being taken to address them:

Habitat loss and land conversion are hugely important. Citizens have responded with tens of millions of dollars in dedicated taxes to buy land, particularly along the river corridor. Water diversions from river have large deleterious ecological consequences, with proposed Glade Reservoir possible coup de grace for health of river. Little done to secure flows for river thus far, but increasing pressure to do so.
